### What have we been doing? Read on...

### Application for centrally funded PLD

We recently applied for 600 hours of Professional Learning and Development - funded by the Ministry of Education, with an additional 400 hours committed by our schools. We are pleased to advise that this application was approved, and it will be used to support initiatives that help us meet our achievement challenges and the emerging themes identified above. Our next step is to identify the most appropriate providers that can help us with addressing our themes and challenges across the Kāhui Ako.

## **Engaging with the RTLB service**

Our Kāhui Ako leaders and Across School team met recently with Lyn Evans (Manager of Nelson Bays Resource Teachers Learning and Behaviour) and some of her team to hear about how they may be able to better support the work in our Community of Learners – particularly in relation to the emerging themes that we have.

### **Across-school lead teachers**

Our across school team meets weekly and between meetings the team are working on a variety of tasks. Over the last month they have visited all schools to meet with principals and staff, and work with the within school lead teachers.
